RULES, REGULATIONS and GENERAL INFORMATION

1 Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Field Trials must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.

2 Please ensure entry forms are legible and the box is ticked if you DO NOT wish your address to appear on the running card.

3 If your dog has a Stud book number, please use it in place of KC registration number.

4 Where an individual enters more than one dog, he/she must nominate his/her first choice.

5 A separate cheque is required for each entry please. Please make cheques payable to GRCS.

6 Cheques of unsuccessful applicants will be destroyed after the trail.

7. Any competitor accepting a run and not taking up the offer may forfeit the full entry fee – The only exception to this will be any competitor who has qualified out of Novice after the entries have closed, Open Stake winners who have qualified for the Championship, on production of a veterinary certificate confirming the dog is unfit to compete, on production of a medical certificate that the nominated handler is unable to compete, or where the dog is withdrawn more than 7 days prior to the stake.

8 The GRCS reserves the right to accept or refuse an entry.

9 In the event of the Stake being cancelled 50% of the entry fee will be refunded.

10 Substitutions of dogs from the Reserve List will be accepted, Substitutions will only be allowed up to 7 days prior to the Trail.

11 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

12 If entries or nominations exceed the number of permitted runners, the right to compete in a Trial shall be decided by ballot.

13. Joint ownership – if a dog is jointly owned – all owners must be members of GRCS.

14. Trophies are held for one year at the responsibility of the winner – to ensure they are returned to the FTS the following year, in a timely fashion and in a clean, presentable condition.

15 It is NOT acceptable for an owner/handler to compete in one trial whilst holding an accepted run in a second overlapping Trial. The Club reserves the right, in such cases to refuse entries to future events.

16 Should circumstances so dictate, GRCS, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.

17 No modification may be made to the schedule after publication except by permission of the Kennel Club, followed by advertisement in appropriate journals if time permits before the closing of entries.

18 Judges at a Trial are prohibited from entering a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership.

19 All competitors and spectators must refrain from assisting handlers whilst they are running their dogs. This includes the use of binoculars and radios, and hand signals.

20 No competitor can withdraw a dog on leave the Trial ground without the express permission of a Judge or the Chief Steward.

21 No Bitches in season

22 Videography and photography will only be permitted with the express permission of the Chief Steward and the host.

23 WELFARE OF DOGS

An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

24 DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
